


What we do

- The County was established in 1837 and the County seat is located in Iowa City.
- The County's population in 1900 was 24,817.
- The County's population in 2019 was 151,140.
- Eleven cities are located within the County.
- Johnson County has more than 900 miles of paved, gravel and dirt roads.
