Prairie Seed Harvests

Helping to harvest prairie seeds allows volunteers to take up an active role in the restoration of our county's native ecosystems, and all collected seed is used for JCC's restoration projects for the next year. The task itself is easy for all ages of volunteers, and no background experience is necessary. Some events require hiking between one and two miles over uneven and mildly sloped terrain. For anyone with mobility limitations, the Senior Seed Harvests are best, and will feature harvest options very close to parking areas. All locations are subject to change based on seed conditions. Monarch Tagging:

Take part in citizen science and monarch butterfly conservation! Volunteers needed to help catch and tag wild monarch butterflies. This effort is an important push to gather as much data as we can about monarch butterfly migration. The small tags label each butterfly with a unique number. Tagged butterflies will journey 2,000 miles to their winter home in Mexico. This activity is great for all ages. We will supply nets. Events are dependent on weather conditions.
