- School Ready Scholarships: I have opened the 2023-2024 school ready scholarship applications and will begin reviewing those on July 1<sup>st</sup>.

## HHS Service Delivery System Assessment

#### Why an assessment?

How lowans access health and human services differ from county to county. With 99 counties in the state, this is a significant challenge for those trying to access services and for the community partners who administer them.

Addressing this issue at a unique moment in time, HHS aims to redefine what service delivery looks like in lowa. There are endless opportunities to harness the expertise and passion of our health and human services workforce, better leverage existing financial resources, and to continue to engage and support our community partners and local stakeholders while acknowledging the evolution of our state's resources and population.

An assessment of these services will give us a clear understanding of:

- The purpose, rationale, and historical context of current service delivery systems
- Scan of providers within the service delivery system
- Funding and resources for service delivery systems
- Linkages between service areas in the current delivery system and Medicaid programs
- Target and priority populations, including number of individuals currently being served
- Decision makers and partners involved in service delivery systems
- Operational capabilities and gaps of the state and local system for service delivery system

#### Why conduct an assessment now?

With the codification of our new agency in July 2023, we are ready to leverage lessons learned from the pandemic to address these challenges and improve our HHS system.

- At least two proposed funding models for the local HHS system.


#### 2022 ECI Family Survey Local Area Report: Johnson County

A Statewide ECI Family Survey was collected between November 2021 and March 2022 using similar questions as the 2019 Family Survey (<u>Early Childhood Iowa, 2019</u>). The full results from this survey, including comparisons between 2019 and 2022 results, were presented to the ECI Stakeholder's Alliance on May 10, 2022 and prepared in a statewide report (<u>I2D2, 2022</u>). The following report was generated in April 2023 by the I2D2 analytic team to reflect a subset of analysis for families from **Johnson County**. The full sample size for this area was 46 families.





Figure 1. "What is your relationship with the children in your home?"






Figure 3. "Have you or your family ever used the following services?"




Figure 4. "Have you or your family ever used the following services?" (Number of services used)




Figure 5. "For each family services and programs, indicate which option best describes your experience."




Figure 6. "When selecting childcare, which of the following factors are the most important in making that selection?"






Figure 7. "What has made it difficult for you to use services designed for families like yours?"








Figure 9. "Rate how adequate you feel the services are in your area."




Figure 10. Percent families reporting low adequacy by service type





Figure 11. "What are the most important areas of support needed for your family's well-being and success?"
