programs and plant sales.

Johnson County Pocket Prairie Program

Provides plants, training, information, and technical assistance to guide participants in adding high-value native plants to their yards, creating a 10' by 10' pocket prairie. These native plantings provide critical pollinator habitat for bees, butterflies and more, and also improve soil health. The Pocket Prairie Program is a collaboration between Johnson County and the Master Gardeners of Johnson County. The program is administered by the Johnson County Planning, Development and Sustainability Department. Johnson County Master Gardeners provides education and technical assistance throughout the process, and works with Johnson County to select, acquire, and distribute plants. Caregiver Corner: Embracing Technology to Ease Caregiving Challenges

Caring for an aging loved one often involves juggling many responsibilities — from managing medications to coordinating appointments and ensuring safety at home.

Thankfully, technology is increasingly becoming a powerful ally for caregivers, helping to reduce stress and improve the quality of care.

Here's how caregivers can harness technology to make their role more manageable and effective:

1. Medication Management Apps

Keeping track of multiple medications can be daunting. Apps like Medisafe and Pill Reminder provide alerts for when it's time to take or refill medications, helping prevent missed doses and harmful errors.

2. Telehealth and Virtual Doctor Visits

Especially important during times when leaving the house is difficult, telehealth allows your loved one to consult with healthcare professionals from home. Many health systems now offer virtual appointments, making medical care more accessible and reducing travel stress.

3. Safety Monitoring Devices

From emergency alert systems with wearable pendants to smart home devices like motion sensors and automatic lights, technology can enhance safety. These tools alert caregivers immediately if a fall or unusual activity is detected.

4. Digital Calendars and Task Sharing

Tools like Google Calendar or CareZone enable caregivers to coordinate appointments, caregiving duties, and family schedules in one place. Sharing access with other family members keeps everyone informed and involved.

5. Cognitive and Social Engagement Apps

Apps designed to stimulate memory and promote social interaction, such as braintraining games and video chat platforms, can support your loved one's mental health and help reduce feelings of isolation.

- Age 55 or older
- · Eligible for nursing facility level of care
- · Live in a PACE service area county
- · Able to live safely in the community at the time of enrollment



Staying Safe in **Hot Weather**

Too much heat is not safe for anyone. It is even riskier if you are older or have health problems. It is important to be cautious and get relief quickly when you are overheated. Otherwise, you might start to feel sick or risk a heat-related illness that could cause serious health issues.

What raises the risk of heat-related illnesses for older adults?

- Older adults are at higher risk for heat-related illnesses and death. Factors that put older adults at greater risk may include:
- Health problems such as cardiovascular, lung, or kidney disease
- · Changes in skin caused by normal aging
- Any illness that causes weakness or results in a fever
- Taking drugs such as diuretics, sedatives, tranquilizers, and some heart and high blood pressure medicines that may make it harder for the body to cool itself
- Being on several prescription drugs at the same time
- Having obesity, overweight, or underweight
- Drinking alcoholic beverages
- Living in places without air conditioning or fans
- · Becoming dehydrated

July 4-6, 2025








