A physical Recheck inspection was conducted. No further action is needed. Corrections observed during this inspection included:

Item #10 All kitchen hand-washing sinks of the facility are accessible and supplied with soap and paper towels. Item #15 Food was stored properly in the correct order. Item #16: The blade of the tabletop can opener was observed to be clean. Item #18 The establishment cooking the chicken to above 165°F. Item #23 All the containers of prepared foods and sauces have the date marking of the preparation date. Item #23 All the containers of prepared foods and sauces are within the 7-day limit for house-made foods. Item #23 The establishment's using the proper thanking methods of food items for properties including in a container.
