Scope of Business: Establishment is a drive through only facility selling coffee, energy drink mixes and prepackaged commercial food.

Certified Food Protection Manager (CFPM): Due to the facility's limited menu and in accordance with lowa Code requirements for CFPM (Certified Food Protection Manager) exemptions, the establishment is currently exempt from CFPM requirements. Should the facility's menu change, the need for CFPM certification will be re-evaluated.

Firm has been made aware of the basic food code requirements applicable to their establishment and current operation. Person in charge understands the responsibility of the permit holder to comply with those requirements. If subsequent on-site inspection reveals non-compliance with regulations, the permit holder agrees to bring violations into full compliance within the time frame specified in the lowa Food Code.
