#15: All raw items properly stored in within walk in cooler.

#20: Cooled foods within walk in cooler had a internal temperature of 41 or below.

#21: Queso in hot holding unit on prep line was holding at a minimum temperature of 135 degrees or higher.

Person in charge agrees to meet CFPM requirements no later than 1/29/2026 and send the inspector a CFPM certificate of completion upon course and exam completion.
