
MPOJC Passenger Transportation Plan Update

February 10, 2026



What is the Metropolitan Planning Organization of Johnson County (MPOJC)?

- A federally-mandated transportation programming and policy-making organization.
- Channels federal and state transportation funds to projects and programs through the cooperative planning and decision-making process.
- Specializes in Transportation, Traffic Engineering, Grant Writing, and Land Use Planning.



What is the Passenger Transportation Plan? (PTP)

- Document required by federal law outlining transportation needs for transit projects seeking funding from federal and state assistance programs over five years.
- Serve as a mobility management tool to help meet the specific passenger transportation needs.

Review PTP Coordination Issues

- Service Needs
 - Examples: transit routes, frequency, hours of operation, transit rider training/education, etc.
- Fleet Needs
 - Examples: number or type of transit vehicles, buses, etc.
- Facility Needs
 - Examples: bus stop shelters
- Status of Past Priorities/Strategies

Discuss Priorities and Strategies

- 5-Year Priorities and Strategies
 - Examples: continue to update the PTP every 5 years, upgrade and renovate transit facilities, evaluate existing service and coordination of both fixed route and paratransit service, support bus shelter revitalization and replacement, continue to provide education materials and ride training programs through the Mobility Coordinator
- Long Term Priorities and Strategies
 - Examples: develop programs for senior riders, continue to evaluate park-and-ride programs in the urbanized area, continue to evaluate bus routes in the urbanized area, look for corporate partners in transportation programs



Violette Bray was also introduced, Violette is the Administrative Services Coordinator for the Optimal Aging Initiative at the Csomay Center for Gerontological Excellence and will be a new Policy Board member.

- 4) Update from Aging Specialist – Kellbach
 - a) Jeff will be giving a presentation on Senior Supports as part of the Community Foundation of Johnson County's Community Conversation series.
 - b) Aging Specialist Statistics- Current Fiscal Year Jeff has worked with 143 clients consisting of 576 documented contacts with these individuals. In the same time period last Fiscal Year Jeff worked with 108 clients with 551 documented contacts with these individuals.
 - c) Aging Specialist/ Navigators combined statistics- Current Fiscal Year the Navigators and Aging Specialist positions have worked with 479 clients consisting of 2,427 documented contacts with these individuals. In the same time period last Fiscal Year the Navigators and Aging Specialist positions have worked with 288 clients with 1,661 documented contacts with these individuals.
- 5) Finance Updates
 - a) Charitable Giving Fund Balance is \$3,600
 - b) FY26 County Funds- \$4,285.68- Expenses thus far include sponsorship of 2025 Caregiver Wellness Day, 2025 membership to Older Iowans Legislature and subscription to Constant Contact for the Newsletter.
- 6) Goals and Action Item Review
 - a) Transportation- Medical Transportation in Johnson County was discussed. Lorraine was asked to draft a goal for medical transportation.
- 7) Durable Medical Equipment Lending Library- Bowans
 - a) Lorraine is looking for space to store used durable medical equipment. She discussed the possibility of doing a Challenge Grant but would need a 501c3 organization to do a grant. She discussed the model

at Grace Episcopal Church in Cedar Rapids where the church provides space for the equipment and the lending library is staffed by volunteers. Liability issues were brought up if this was part of JCLC/ County and would require the Board of Supervisors and County Attorney approval. Discussion of whether there was the possibility of a storage unit donating space as a write off. Lorraine will follow up with Grace Episcopal with what they use to cover liability and send to John.
