The following items are repeat risk factor violations. The person in charge stated they will implement the following long-term corrective actions:

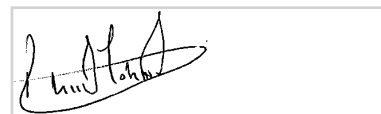
