

POLICY BOARD UPDATES



JOHNSON COUNTY RESIDENTS INVITED TO SHARE THEIR VIEWS ON LIVABILITY FOR AGING SUCCESSFULLY

The Johnson County Livable Community for Successful Aging Policy Board is launching a survey aimed at understanding the experiences and perceptions of residents aged 45 and older regarding livability in Johnson County.

A livable community is one where everyone can age successfully, providing safe, walkable streets, age-friendly housing, accessible transportation options, and opportunities for all residents to engage in community life. The survey will cover critical topics related to livability and is designed to capture the voices of county residents. Participants can complete the survey online by scanning the QR Code below, www.livablecommunity.org or request a paper survey by calling (319)-335-1664.

"The insights gained from this survey will be invaluable," said John Kalohn, Chair of the Policy Board, "We aim to understand how we can enhance livability for all ages in Johnson County, ensuring that our community is a place where everyone can thrive."

The survey will begin in early December with a gradual rollout in rural communities, followed by expansion into the metropolitan area of Johnson County. All Johnson County residents aged 45 and older are encouraged to participate.

SOCIAL SECURITY & MEDICARE CHANGES



Social Security Announces 2.5 Percent Benefit Increase for 2025


Social Security benefits and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments for more than 72.5 million Americans will increase **2.5 percent** in 2025. On average, Social Security retirement benefits will increase by about \$50 per month starting in January.



Medicare part B -- will be \$185 for 2025, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services announced. This is an increase of \$10.30. Find out more HERE.

Medicare Open Enrollment

When's the Medicare Open Enrollment Period?

Medicare's open enrollment period is October 15 - December 7.

What's the Medicare Open Enrollment Period?

Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year—things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. October 15 to December 7 is when all people with Medicare can change their Medicare health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs.

How do people know if they need to change plans?

People in a Medicare health or prescription drug plan should always review the materials their plans send them, like the "Evidence of Coverage" (EOC) and "Annual Notice of Change" (ANOC). If their plans are changing, they should make sure their plans will still meet their needs for the following year. If they're satisfied that their current plans will meet their needs for next year and it's still being offered, they don't need to do anything.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES





Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) is a national IRS sponsored program that provides free tax preparation of federal and state tax returns for low income households. On average, it costs a taxpayer nearly \$300 to have their return prepared and filed by a tax firm. This money can instead be used for basic needs, such as groceries and rent.

Volunteers are critical to the success of the VITA program. VITA volunteers are needed to help prepare and file tax returns. No previous experience is necessary. Volunteers will complete IRS training to become certified tax preparers. Volunteer greeters are also needed to welcome tax payers to the tax clinics and gather needed paperwork.

Anyone can get sick with flu. Typically, children and people age 65 and older are most at risk of developing serious complications from influenza.

Flu is a serious disease, caused by influenza viruses, that can lead to hospitalization and even death. Every flu season is different, and the substantial health impacts can vary widely from season to season, with some flu seasons being worse than others. Suicide Warning Signs for Adults



Risk is greater if a behavior is new or has increased, and if it seems related to a painful event, loss, or change.

- Talking about or making plans for suicide.
- Acting anxious or agitated; behaving recklessly.
- Talking about being a burden to others.
- Talking about feeling trapped or in unbearable pain.
- Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs.
- Talking about feeling hopeless or having no reason to live.
- Sleeping too little or too much.
- · Withdrawing or feeling isolated.
- Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge.
- Displaying extreme mood swings.




