



## **ADA Voting in Johnson County** THE EXPRESSVO



Did you know that in all voting locations in Iowa, ADA voting machines must be made available to voters? In Johnson County, we use the ExpressVote; it is a reliable, secure, and efficient machine that combines touch screen technology and a printer to produce paper record for tabulation. The machine is accessible while maintaining an independent process for voters.

If you have trouble seeing the ballot when voting, this machine can help!

- · The machine can display larger text and high contrast colors, making the screen easier to read.
- Voters can use assistive input devices, including audio-tactile keypad with Braille legends, twoposition rocker switch, and a sip-and-puff
- The machine is equipped with headphones to

- · Voters who are blind or have a visual impairment can blank the screen so that they cannot be observed.
- The machine has screen prompts, symbols and audio prompts that help voters navigate the voting process.





# Is It Allergies, a Cold, or COVID?



### Here's How to Tell the Difference

Sniffling, sneezing, and feeling tired? Knowing whether you're dealing with allergies, a common cold, or COVID-19 can be tricky. Here's a quick guide to help you tell them apart:

### **Allergies**

- Symptoms: Sneezing, runny or stuffy nose, itchy eyes/nose/throat, watery eyes.
- Key Clues: Symptoms often come on quickly and last as long as you're exposed to allergens like pollen, dust, or pets. Allergies don't generally cause a fever.
- Tip: Allergy medications like antihistamines usually help.

### Common Cold

- Symptoms: Runny nose, sore throat, cough, congestion, mild fatigue, sometimes a low-grade fever.
- · Key Clues: Colds usually develop slowly over a few days and last about a week.
- Tip: Rest, fluids, and over-the-counter remedies can ease symptoms.

### COVID-19

- Symptoms: Fever, cough, fatigue, body aches, sore throat, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, congestion, and sometimes gastrointestinal symptoms.
- Key Clues: COVID-19 symptoms can look like a cold but often include more intense fatigue, fever, and loss of taste or smell.
- Tip: If you're unsure or have been exposed to COVID-19, take a test to be safe.

### When in Doubt, Get Tested

Because symptoms can overlap, the safest choice if you're feeling unwell — especially if you have a fever or cough — is to take a COVID-19 test and limit contact with others until you know more.

### **Protect Your Skin: May is Skin Cancer Awareness Month**

As we head into warmer months, it's the perfect time to remember the importance of protecting your skin. Skin cancer is the most common cancer in the United States — but it's also one of the most preventable.

### Here's how you can protect yourself:

- Use sunscreen: Apply a broad-spectrum sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher every day, even on cloudy days.
- Seek shade: Especially during midday hours (10 a.m. to 4 p.m.)
   when the sun's rays are strongest.
- Wear protective clothing: Hats, sunglasses, and long sleeves can help shield your skin.
- Avoid tanning beds: They increase your risk for skin cancer, including melanoma.
- Check your skin: Look for new or changing spots and talk to a healthcare provider about any concerns.

Early detection saves lives. This May, commit to healthy skin habits — and encourage your friends and family to do the same! For more tips and information, visit the American Cancer Society website.

### **COMMUNITY UPDATES**

Residents in Johnson County, including the unincorporated area and smaller towns, can reduce home energy use, increase indoor comfort and save money on energy bills by scheduling a no-cost home energy audit with Green Iowa AmeriCorps. The program is open to those who own houses or apartments, and renters can participate by getting permission from their landlord.

The audit assesses how much energy a home uses and identifies steps to improve energy efficiency. There is no fee for the service, and the audit team can work around residents' schedules for the home visit.

- You don't need to use your library card or visit a service desk.



# Guidelines for donating seeds:

- Seed donations are accepted but not required for use of the Seed Library!
- ICPL accepts seeds saved from gardens and commercial seed packets.
- Seeds should be clean, dry, unexposed to pesticides, and open-pollinated.
- Envelopes are provided for seed donations - please fill out as much information as you know about the seeds, and your name and email or home address.
